"And Warn Them Of The Day Of Regret When The Matter Will Be Concluded..."

All praise is due to Allah, the Lord of all creation; may Allah extol our noble Prophet Muhammad in the highest company of Angels and bless him, send him peace and security—and his family, his Companions and all those who truly follow him until the establishment of the Hour.

There is a tremendous āyah in the Book of Allah that every Muslim should pay attention to, and that is the saying of Allah (سُبْحَانَهُ وَتَعَالُهُ):

"And warn them [O Muhammad] of the Day of Regret when the matter will be concluded, while they are [in this life] in a state of heedlessness, and they do not believe." (Maryam: 39)

Allah commanded His Prophet (المَالَّالَةُ اللهُ) to warn the people of that Day of Regret and Grief, and that is the Day of Resurrection—the Day on which grief will be severe and regrets immense. And what grief could be worse than, at the end of everything, the life that you lived, that you lose the pleasure of Allah, His love and His Paradise? Instead, you earn His anger, displeasure and punishment. And as for the disbelievers and idolators, for them there is the Hellfire from which there is no return—they will wish to be returned so they can worship Allah and perform good deeds, but that will not happen!

Those who meet Allah with disobedience and sins are the true losers. Allah (شَيْحَالَةُ وَتَعَالَىٰ) said:

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قُلْ إِنَّ ٱلْخَاسِرِينَ ٱلَّذِينَ خَسِرُوٓا أَنفُسَهُمْ وَأَهْلِيهِمْ يَوْمَ ٱلْقِيَامَةِ ۗ أَلَا ذَالِكَ هُوَ ٱلْغَاسِرِينَ ٱلَّذِينَ خَسِرُوٓا أَنفُسَهُمْ وَأَهْلِيهِمْ يَوْمَ ٱلْقِيَامَةِ ۗ أَلَا ذَالِكَ هُوَ ٱلْخُسْرَانُ ٱلْمُبِينُ

"Say to them: Indeed, the losers are the ones who will lose themselves and their families on the Day of Resurrection. Surely, that is the manifest loss." (Az-Zumar: 15)

Ibn 'Abbās (said: "Yawm Al-Hasrah (the Day of Regret) is one of the names of Yawm Al-Qiyāmah (the Day of Resurrection)—Allah mentioned its immensity and warned His servants from it."

Abdur-Rahmān Ibn Zayd Ibn Aslam (وَهَمُهُاللَّهُ) said: "Allah's saying: 'And warn them of the Day of Regret and Grief...' It is the Day of Resurrection. Allah (شَهَمَاهُوَتَعَالَيُّ) stated:

'Lest a person should say: Alas, my grief that I was undutiful to Allah, and I was indeed among those who mocked [Islam and the believers].' (Az-Zumar: 56)

As for His (شُبْحَاتُهُوْتَعَالَىُ) saying, **'when the matter will be concluded...'** meaning, it is concluded when the reckoning is finished, and the inhabitants of Paradise have entered Paradise and the inhabitants of the Fire have entered the Fire.

As for His (شَيْحَانَةُوْتَعَالَىُّ) saying, 'and yet they are in a state of heedlessness...' meaning, in this world they are engrossed with their desires and whims, and heedless of what will take place on the Day of Regret and Grief.

As for His (شَبْحَاتُهُوْتَعَالَ) saying, **'and they do not believe.'** They do not believe in the resurrection after death, or in the bliss,

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happiness and joy for those who obeyed Allah, and the severe torment and punishment for those who disobeyed Him."

The matter will indeed be concluded and finalised. Abu Sa'īd Al-Khudrī (مَعْنَيْفَةُ) narrated that Allah's Messenger (مَا النَّهُ عَلَيْهُ) said:

يُوْ تَى بِالْمَوْتِ كَهَيْئَةِ كَبْشٍ أَمْلَحَ فَيُنَادِى مُنَادٍ يَا أَهْلَ الْجُنَّةِ فَيَشْرَبِبُّونَ وَيَنْظُرُونَ فَيَقُولُ هَلْ تَعْرِفُونَ هَذَا فَيَقُولُونَ نَعَمْ هَذَا الْمُوْتُ وَكُلُّهُمْ قَدْ رَآهُ ثُمَّ يُنَادِى يَا أَهْلَ النَّارِ فَيَشْرَبِبُّونَ وَيَنْظُرُونَ فَيَقُولُ هَلْ تَعْرِفُونَ هَذَا فَيَقُولُونَ نَعَمْ هَذَا الْمَوْتُ وَكُلُّهُمْ قَدْ رَآهُ فَيُدْبَحُ ثُمَّ يَقُولُ يَنْظُرُونَ فَيَقُولُ هَلْ تَعْرِفُونَ هَذَا فَيَقُولُونَ نَعَمْ هَذَا الْمَوْتُ وَكُلُّهُمْ قَدْ رَآهُ فَيُدْبَحُ ثُمَّ يَقُولُ يَا أَهْلَ الْجُنَّةِ خُلُودً فَلاَ مَوْتَ ثُمَّ قَرَأً "وَأَنْذِرْهُمْ يَوْمَ الْحُسْرَةِ إِذْ قُضِى الأَمْرُ وَهُمْ فِي غَفْلَةٍ " وَهَوُلاَءِ فِي غَفْلَةٍ أَهْلُ الدُّنْيَا "وَهُمْ لاَ يُؤْمِنُونَ"

"Death will be brought forth on the Day of Resurrection in the form of a black and white ram, [Abu Kurayb added: And it is made to stand between Paradise and the Fire]. Then it will be said: 'O people of Paradise!' Thereupon they will stretch their necks and look carefully. The caller will say, 'Do you know what this is?' They will respond, 'Yes, it is death.' And all of them will have seen it. Then it will be said, 'O people of the Fire!' They will stretch their necks and look carefully. The caller will say, 'Do you know what this is?' They will say, 'Yes, it is death.' And all of them will have seen it. Then the ram will be slaughtered, and the caller will say, 'O people of Paradise! Eternal life and no more death. O people of the Fire! Eternal life and no more death." Then the Prophet (مَا لَلْهُ عَلَيْهِ وَسَالًا), recited the verse: "And warn them of the Day of Regret, when the matter will be concluded, and yet they are [in this life] in a state of heedlessness, and they do not believe." And he (مَا لَلْهُ عَلَيْهِ وَسَالًا) pointed with his hand to the world.1

In the wording of Ibn 'Umar (مَالِتُعَالِيُوسَلَةِ), the Prophet (صَالِتُعَالِيوسَلَةِ) said: "So the people of Paradise will increase in joy on top of their joy and the and the people of the Fire will increase in their misery on top of their misery."

In another narration he (مَالِسُهُ عَلَيْهُ said: "If it were possible for anyone to die of joy, the people of Paradise would've died of joy. And if it were possible for anyone to die of grief, the people of the Fire would've died of grief."

Some Of The Lessons We Can Learn From This Āyah

One: The Day of Regret and Grief will be a Day on which the unbeliever will severely regret his disbelief in Allah, and the oppressor will regret his injustices, the sinner will regret his sins, the disobedient will regret his disobedience and the innovator in Islam will regret that he practised innovations and opposed Ahlus-Sunnah wal-Jamā'ah. But regret on that Day will be of no avail because no one will be sent back to the world to rectify his transgressions. A group from the believers will be punished in the Fire, and then released from it and given entry to Paradise. As for the unbelievers, the idolators and hypocrites, then they will enter the Fire and will never leave it. Allah (شَهَالَةُ said:

"The Day when their excuses will be of no profit to wrong-doers. Theirs will be the curse, and theirs will be the evil abode." (Ghāfir: 52)

Two: The believer should never be heedless, rather he is constantly preparing himself to meet His Lord and be prepared for the reckoning. Allah (شَيْعَالُهُوْقِعَالُ stated:

"Whoever hopes for the meeting with Allah, then Allah's term is surely coming, and He is the All-Hearer, the All-Knower." (Al-'Ankabūt: 5)

Three: On the Day of Regret, the unbeliever will think that he hardly spent any time in the world. He will think in his mind that it was like an hour of the day, or a part of a morning or a portion of a night. Allah (شَبْعَانُوْقِعَالًى) stated:

"And on the Day when He shall gather them together, it will be as if they had not stayed in the life of this world but for an hour of a day." (Yūnus: 45) And He (شَيْعَاتُهُوْتَعَالَى) said:

"The Day they see the Resurrection, it will be as if they had not tarried in this world except an afternoon or a morning." (An-Nāzi'āt: 46)

Four: From the greatest grief of that Day upon the unbeliever and wrong-doer is that he will be willing to be killed rather than face the punishment of Allah, or sacrifice his son, his wife, his brother and all of humanity—and ransom himself with all of the treasures of the world if he could. Allah (قَالُونَهُنَانَ) said:

يُبَصَّرُونَهُمْ أَيَودُ ٱلْمُجْرِمُ لَوْ يَفْتَدِى مِنْ عَذَابِ يَوْمِبٍذِ بِبَنِيهِ وَصَلْحِبَتِهِ وَأَخِيهِ وَفَصِيلَتِهِ ٱلَّتِي تُعْوِيهِ وَمَن فِي ٱلْأَرْضِ جَمِيعًا ثُمَّ يُنجِيهِ كَلَّ إِنَّهَا لَظَىٰ

"They will be made to see each other on the Day of Resurrection. The criminal, sinner and disbeliever would desire to ransom himself from the punishment of that Day by his children, his wife, his brother and his nearest kindred who sheltered him. And all that are in the earth, so that it might save him. By no means! Verily, it will be [for him] the Fire of Hell." (Al-Ma'ārij: 11-15)

Allah (سُبْحَانَهُ وَتَعَالَىٰ) also said:

"Verily, those who disbelieved, and died while they were disbelievers, the whole earth full of gold will not be accepted from anyone of them even if they offered it as a ransom. For them is a painful torment and they will have no helpers." ($\bar{\text{Ali}}$ 'Imrān: 91)

Anas Ibn Mālik (هَا الْعَالَيْنَ) narrated that Allah's Messenger (المَا الله الله) said: "Allah will say to the person who receives the least punishment from the inhabitants of the Hellfire: 'If you had the equivalent of the whole world and whatever is in it, would you ransom yourself from the punishment with it?' He will respond: 'Yes.' Allah will say: 'But I asked you for much less

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than that while you were still in the loins of Adam—that you are not to worship others besides Me, but you refused and insisted on worshipping others besides me."⁵

Five: It is a must that the believer guards his Religion and maintains his worship and obedience to Allah until he dies. Allah (شَبْحَانَةُ وَقَعَالَ) said:

"O you who have believed, fear Allah as He should be feared and do not die except as Muslims [in submission to Him]." (Āli 'Imrān: 102)

A believer protects himself from heedlessness and destruction through the worship of Allah and remembrance (dhikr) of Him throughout the days and nights of his life, showing Him obedience—and by keeping away from ingratitude, disobedience, sin and sinful companionship. The Messenger of Allah (شَهَاتُهُوْتَعَالَ) used to say often:

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"O You who makes hearts steadfast, make our hearts steadfast upon your Religion." So say this repeat this often, and in your prostrations.
